# **Naming names at Association of England**

From the Minutes of the Association's AGM we learn a motion had been proposed by John Perratt, SWVAC Secretary, not present, and seconded by Bill Valentine but was withdrawn. Further we understand the vote on the name change on 'Item 11' was 6 in favour, 1 against, and 1 abstention.

Although Item 11 is not spelled out it was probably to change the name to

On Item 11, 1 against was Ron Franklin(VAC), the abstention we understand was Bill Valentine(SWVAC).

The 6 in favour would seem to be Edgar Nicholls(Mid) and 5 more from the 10 present, and drawn from just 3 clubs. But the Chair had declared ambiguously

## "only the clubs could vote"

Clearly the other five votes must have come out of Bridget Cushen(Sec)(SC & VAC), Danny Mullane(Treas)(EVAC), Eric Horwill(RW Sec) (MMAC), Arthur Kimber(T&F Sec)(SC & VAC), Phil Lee(CC Sec)(EVAC) and Winston Thomas(SCVAC), sitting in. So five of these persons must have voted for their club as well as being officers and therefore we say the words attributed to Chair are misleading.

Also in previous AGM Chair's report Irene Nicholls had told the meeting "make sure your Club vote reflects your views".

What was that meant to mean?

This attitude and uncertainty could explain the absence of the northern clubs, thinking they had no chance against the insiders.

## Two votes per club

There had been uncertainty about one vote or two and no prospect of finding a second delegate in VAC on a club meet day.

Earlier Ron Franklin had expressed his view in Council that the vote of the clubs should represent the views of their members and it was agreed. There is no mention in the February AGM of this urging by our respected member.

A similar view was expressed by senior commentator Martin Duff in external correspondence. He argues that since Vets, Southern Counties, SWV, North, IoM and North East had

kept the name Veteran the result should have been to keep the name Veteran in VAAofE.

SCVAC Committee, despite their name and poll, had, it was thought, authorised Arthur Kimber to vote as he thought fit.

Contributing to the uncertainty was rumour of financial support.

Constitution of the Association was requested by us from Secretary Cushen but was not supplied. While VAC Secretary Williams was unaware of having received it. Was that bona fide?

All in all these seem unsatisfactory proceedings.

But at the end of the day athletics in general does veterans, not dubious masters.

## **Delegates Meeting**

CC Sec Phil Lee said that clubs could only send one representative to International Selection meeting to nominate both men and women. In my experience for VAC on the Womens selection, without expense claim by the way, while Charlie Dickinson represented the men, there was a definite shortage of expertise on the women's side. E.g. mis-selections of Kate Ramsey and Ros Tabor.

Dickinson, who has huge experience, feels one rep only would mean loss of expertise and an overlong meeting.

Regarding the International, self-congratulations in the Minutes suggests England might not have won, but for the sterling efforts of the officers! Meanwhile they keep quiet about the venue chosen for this year. It is Isle of Man, but they just say England.

The so-called Inter Area T&F was discussed. Teams are to be invited from Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland – to make up for none from VAC possibly. The club is used to being totally ignored.

A comic slip from the Race Walk Sec was how Captain Barclay walked his famous challenge of 1,000 miles in 6 days. It was of course 6 weeks.

# VAC Track champion fortified at 40

degree then followed at Southampton University with three years as an undergraduate plus three years before qualifying as a Clinical Psychologist, during which time she showed no interest in anything athletic.

"I didn't even know that there was a running track there," she admitted, "and I was more interested in visit-

ing the union bar". Looking back on those student days, Anna regrets that she didn't get involved in the athletic scene.

It was at 24 that Anna decided to run her first race since her schooldays with a 10km event completed in 42 minutes. "I also ran the Great South Run (10miles) but I can't even remember what time I did."

Come 1995 and now employed as a Clinical Psychologist. Anna moved to north London and ioined North London AC - now London Heathside.

"It opened my eyes joining a running club," admitted Anna, "and it was a trigger for me. I did all the Met League CCs and ran a marathon under three hours. although marathons are not for me; I enjoy the shorter distances."

It was in 2001 and the two years following that Anna enjoyed the best of times, in a period she admits, "provided me with my favourite athletic memories".

She displayed a mean pace with 2:17 over 800m and 4:41 over 1500m prior to impressive distance displays in 2002 which resulted in 5-miles (28:36), 10k (35:54) and 10-miles (58.53).

"That was my favourite race." says Anna, speaking of her performance in the classic Cabbage Patch 10 at Twickenham.

The 2002 National cross-country held in atrocious conditions at Bristol, saw Anna in the sharp end with a brilliant placing of 29th while in 2003, a 38th placing in the Inter Counties named her in the winning Middlesex team, to confirm her 13th in the South of England Senior.

Coached by her husband Mark, himself a record setter in VAC, Anna does much of her training with members of West 4 Harriers, now her first claim club.

In what is a pretty basic schedule, a long run of some 70-minutes is done on a Sunday with a hill session on Tuesday and speed work on Thursday; the latter two on the injury friendly fields of the Poly in Chiswick.

Anna is employed as a Clinical Psychologist at Charing Cross Hospital where she helps young people with their mental health problems. Surprisingly she admits to "being negative in some of my races, especially if feeling a bit below par and find myself letting runners pass me before I pick up the pace towards the end".

Judging by recent results, there are no motivational problems these days for Anna, perhaps remembering earlier athletic advice given by West 4 team mate Marion Rayner, a frequent winner of London Marathon veteran titles.

"You are still really young, Anna," said Marion. "Have a focus and don't let the years pass you by".

December 4, 2007 was a date that appeared to have re-ignited the racing career of Anna Critchlow, having celebrated her 40th birthday on that red letter day. Then during the following year she competed often and quickly to put her among the leading W40 runners of the time.

A glance at Athletics Data website shows that last year Anna competed in no less than 33 races, 16 of which saw her first woman home in 5km park runs.

Such was the standard of her performances, the final British W40 rankings for 2008 showed her as second over 10,000m (37:33.05) and sixth best over both 5,000m track (18:15.75), both being VAC champs. Also 5km road (17:53) and ninth in the half-marathon (81:14).

Anna's introduction to athletics was low key at best, when as Anna Solly, she attended St Martin's-in-the-Field High School for Girls in Tulse Hill, where, she admits, "We did one cross-country race a year and a few training sessions in Brockwell Park. To be honest, I didn't really enjoy racing; preferring to run on my own."

# **VAC's new cross country champion**

Now in her second season as a W45, Alison Brownhill is a force to be reckoned with, especially at the longer distances. Always sporty and never averse to fun runs or local 10ks, Alison only really took up running consistently in 2002 when she joined the local club at Maidenhead, "more for social reasons than anything else," she says, having just moved there from London.

She soon discovered the benefits of regular training.

Maidenhead has a good standard and she found that running with people who were faster than she raised her game. She also met Dave Waterman there and his coaching has been central to Alison's marathon preparation ever since. Returning to live in London a couple of years later, she immediately joined the West4 W40 group where in addi-



tion to regular fast runs she added effort sessions. Her subsequent 3:03 in the 2006 London Marathon was the product of five years' steady improvement borne of systematic preparation and, above all, having a coach.

Training four to five times a week plus a long Sunday run, Alison ups this to six sessions in the weeks prior to a marathon. "I limit full marathons to one or two per year because they do take it out of you," she says wisely. An old skiing injury to her knee kept her out of the 2007 event, but she was back in 2008 with 3:14 and rounded the year off with a fine 3:16 on the notoriously hilly Hastings course. "I hail from there so I have to go back for that one."

Alison is a keen cross country athlete, enjoying the variety of surface and terrain. She is a regular in Surrey League and Vet races and her VAC shot this year – first at Wimbledon in January was very impressive. She attributes her form to all the preparation for Hastings the previous month. For someone who loves the country, it is not really a surprise that the track has never appealed to her.

However, marathon training pays dividends at shorter distances on the road as Alison's bests in recent seasons of 19:25 at 5k and 39:20 at 10k attest. She favours the Saturday morning Park Runs in Richmond. "It makes a good outing. I run from



home in Mortlake, race and run home." 19:50 was her 2008 best, pretty brisk on a good three mile warm up!

Alison has learned to pace herself, especially having lost much of 2007 to injury. She is careful to carry out strengthening exercises as well as warming up and feels that careful management should keep the knee problem at bay. Besides a gap between the longer events such as half marathons, she believes in fitting her running round her life and not vice versa.

So saying, the family holiday at Lanzarote's Club la Santa in February "did involve a certain amount of running," but the opportunity to run twice a day in the warm with pilates or yoga sessions for variety at midday was simply too good to miss.

For 2009, Alison will see off the remainder of the country season, then switch to the road. "I'm not going to be in good enough shape to set a pb in this year's London so my objective is to save my big effort for this year's Berlin Marathon."

# Lea Valley Report

Kirsten King was once again the dominant woman at sprint.

The nearest to her was Eastern's Alstrachen. Her turn came in a rare 200 when she shaded Sally Read-Cayton by one hundredth of a sec. Then versatile Sally ran Surrey League cross country the following week, in the top 50.

Fastest VAC men were naturally the younger groups such as Leon Braithwaite, 7.42, and Barrrington King, now M40, on 7.90. But Glen Reddington, 45, won in 7.84, which was also the time of John Browne, now a relatively super vet at 55. John took the all VAC 50+ heat from Brian Matthews of Worthing who was top in our T&F last summer.

An all VAC 200m race had Joan Trimble hold the two Epsoms, Anne Nelson and new, to us, Sue Dassie, with Mary Axtell well there.

Other Epsoms were successful too. David Blunt cleared 1.51 in HJ. M65 was well filled at 200 where Terry Bissett and big Ian Foster did battle in the top two lanes. Long-timer Chuck from Chicago Isetts got the bronze while Al Sowden was pleased with his fifth.

Philip Bell and Mike May renewed rivalry from the summer. Gary Palmer took the mixed age 400m from new Michael Vassiliou from nearby Cheshunt, with Andy Hunt close.

Dulwich's Mike Mann was out on his own in 800 and 1500m races, 4:56, but enjoying a burnup on the bends.

Class act Nigel Gates bided his time in the faster 1500m but duly asserted pace for 4:35. Then he was advising Pat Gallagher whom he coaches after her two runs. Ros Tabor chased the Westbury virtuoso hard but was unable to quite close the gap.

Hurdler Barry Ferguson, M65 gold, glided the small obstacles with a time little off those of his juniors.

Throws were limited to Shot Putt which event was less than

conspicuous at the side. Once again Open entrants, who seldom join a club we notice, dominated but Liz Sissons was third best all women with 9.70. Tony Richards was well there on 11.15 before Peter Virgo, 10.87, led half a dozen senior VACs. Performance seemed to fall a little short of outdoor levels.

Brian Harlick had a busy day with 2.50m Pole Vault before Alan Easey took the bar up to 3 metres.

The Worthing gang, four strong and doubtless braced by sea air, came up to Lea Valley. So Alison Duke was well out in Long Jump at 4.19m, after a 2.50 Vault, 20 cms better than her VAC outdoor. And there were more from the coast.

A novel approach was David Kuester, warming up for throws with a long jump. We believe he has an athletics history.

All told some 48 VAC members competed in 91 VAC events, not counting seven in pentathlon.

Mike Mann, also elevated to 60, was a real threat to Allan.

The first woman came in tenth place, Alison Brownhill, but her challenger Cathy Ulliott was only six seconds behind, with Graham Ball between them.

Strider Bob Ewens led Martin Miller from the south coast on lap one followed by Steve McDuell.






