

Committee News: January report

However Treasurer reported VAC Indoors delivered profit share of £124, while Surrey League paid £30 and 7M Walk had contributed £44. At track Serpentine RC have kindly have offered to share the cost of 7 April meet.

The False Starts Rule was deemed to not apply to veterans competition.

Secretary told the meeting a new club house at Wimbledon Track had just been opened by Royalty. Then 10K Road invitation by Herc Wim, at same venue, was warmly welcomed.

NEWS AND VIEWS

CC Secretary says Surrey League AGM may be significant for VAC. Because if Kent AC are approved and come up into Div 3 that will increase pressure on VAC. A new team applying for Division 4 is Surrey University, who may have youth and also take 2nd-claimers away from local clubs. So the outlook remains good but VAC will need all their talent, like winning the last match, a best showing for many years.

The **fixture card** shows a wealth of information, Officers, trophies and AGM, but more pertinently all champs events with performance and title holders. This is a guide to standards you may expect and conversely to which events are not so well competed. E.g. womens 400m and some of mens; Womens jumps; M40 jumps; M45 and 50 middle distance; Women's 5K Road; Women's 3K Walk; and more.

New members may find this a guide and another suggestion for them if uncertain is to come to a meet, observe, and talk to people.

Champs Best Performances (CBP) are zealously recorded elsewhere but many of the old marks appear to be very high by recent standards. There is little we can do about that except give due praise if you do bring one down. As they say at graduations "aim high, young people".

New races. VAC has been spreading its net more widely of late. The East Surrey League and Herc Wim 5M Multi Terrain have extended hospitality towards us, and the so-called Inter Area has been embraced. When you need a reason to run it provides an alternative dimension – team spirit.

Why Masters doesn't work – time for a rethink, prompted by reading "European T&F" where Veterans is left out and a senior personage writing that "he was a master athlete".

We maintain the term Masters doesn't work in place of Veterans because it doesn't do the job.

It doesn't say anything about age. Indeed Master is still used for a boy in some circles.

The tone is obviously masculine so it only appeals to some women while others dislike it.

It came from America because Veteran was associated with Vietnam veteran, which was bad history. But in Europe Veterans has been retained by the governing body. It is wrong therefore of BMAF to edit out the word veteran in their publications and website – we had an example lately simply saying "European T&F".

It was brought in substantially by one person in England, Maurice Doogan, who obtained a small majority at AGM on the argument that sponsors would not support a body calling itself Veteran. So has sponsorship for the British Masters been any better? Whatever you call us Britain is noted for ageism and sponsors are sure to like youth.

If you take the language approach, we say master means one with rule over others, such schoolmaster, ships master, Master of Pembroke College, and other titles, or in the second meaning a skilled practitioner, an adept or expert such as master craftsman, master builder, master of arts.

It's true the class masters has been adopted in some sports but looking at major sports we see Masters Golf is open including Tiger Woods et al. Masters Tennis is similar while older age tennis is catered for by Seniors Tennis.

On this note a leading veteran has said athletics ought to use Senior for older people. This may be a revolutionary suggestion but how much sense does it make for a 21 year old to be called a Senior. Could they not more sensibly be called plain Athlete, neither a YA nor a Senior. But athletics is weak on terminology; it doesn't like horse racing have a Weatherbys at the centre to impose order.

A basic but important aspect is the sound of the word. Masters has a harsh barking sound, like nazi, gestapo and more that may appeal to some. With a hint towards Master Race.

Even though most clubs are veteran, we still await a full democratic vote by every member.

John Hall

John Hall is remarkable in that at 60 years of age he is able to combine race walking at a high level with much administration in the sport. He was the 2009 President of Belgrave Harriers, from 38 years a member, and is a past President of Middlesex County, as well as holding admin posts with Civil Service athletics. Recently he was the British Team Manager at Kamloops Indoors, working hard to make up teams, and gaining a silver medal himself. While at Copthall 2009 he was invariably the Middlesex track walk Champion. Not bad for a man over 60!

In April '09, he was fifth overall in the National 50k at Stockton-on-Tees in 5:39:22 soon after setting the British M60 record for 3K with a time of 14:45.25 at Lee Valley. Then he went on to gain two Gold medals in the European Veterans Games in Italy, at 3k indoors and the 5k outdoors in 25:48. When he won the M55 3K at Birmingham in '08 in 14:59.23 it was by well over three minutes. While two of his best times ever are 45:58.0 for 10K in '76 and 12:53.28 for 3K in '82.

For Great Britain he competed in a Van Damme Meeting. "That was thirty years ago this year. I was overtaken by a Belgian coming into the stadium so did not get on the podium but it was quite an experience, as it was my only British vest!"

About his two Euro Vets Titles this year at Ancona he explained: 'It was a lovely stadium, better facilities than you very often get for indoor meetings in Europe.

The versatile race walker shoulders a load of official duty, says Alastair Aitken


You actually had somewhere where you could warm up inside. If you are trapped and unable to do anything, it is very frustrating and you don't know what is going to happen till you get on the track." He continued "In the 3K indoors I thought there would probably be someone who would go off fast and set it up but in fact I was in front immediately.

The Frenchman came past me and stayed in front of me for a lap which was a perfect pace for me but I knew I had to move on. With walking you can't afford to leave it till the end as somebody could actually dodge past you.

"You have got to go out and do it so I pushed for the second lap and went out the front and eventually dropped them. With the 5K outdoors it was a completely mad start. By the time we got to the road, after 300m on the track, I was back in sixth place. I could see the others in front and worked to get up to them, held it for a bit, then drifted ahead. Once you are in front you have to got to push it. I was in front from about 2K, felt strong and kept going."

I pointed out to John Hall that I had been well up in a couple of City of London charity walks but noticed that Roger Mills, Paul Nihill and Ian Richards were near me and all became or were international race walkers. Did he feel more club runners could do well as race walkers?

"Really more ought to try it. It



tends to be injury that brings people across to walking. They think, OK, this is alright, I can make progress. Nick Silvester of Aldershot and Trevor Jones of Hillingdon are examples." He pointed out that they had to master the style so they did not get disqualified, learn the trade and put in the training; then they got the rewards.

John Hall came back from South Africa in '71 after several years and soon got involved with Civil Service athletics. "At Ministry of Agriculture sports I won the walk so comfortably I thought the next year I would have a run and came second in the 1500. That happened for a couple of years. In my 23rd Sports Day I managed to win the 1500, as well as the 3,000, and picked up a few Civil Service running medals. That was usually Vets or in team events.

I even managed a sub 3 marathon when I was doing running as well as walking. But walking was the thing as I knew I was not as good at running!"

Personal viewpoint by Pete Mulholland

John Lennon and Paul McCartney famously wrote, "I get by with a little help from my friends" and although penned in 1967, it could well refer to the situation many a current athletic club finds itself in.

It was brought home to me at a recent Veterans AC cross-country race on just how much the sport relies upon for assistance from a few friends and usually those of a certain age.

Why, there was Bob Belmore no spring chicken is Bob - who pulls the strings together for track and field, cross-country and road running in arguably the finest programme of activities enjoyed by any Veterans club in the country, busy marking and dismantling the course over a period of six hours

Added to this was race recorder 92-year-old Ron Hopcroft, who rarely turns down a request to officiate for the club in all disciplines and all weathers.

I would also hark back to last year's Veterans AC Track & Field Championships when the three track judges consisted of Ron plus Jack Fitzgerald, who celebrated his 87th birthday earlier this year, and yours truly - a mere youngster at the age of 70!

It is not only Veterans AC who are having problems attracting younger personnel, having just read of the disbandment of Redhill & Surrey Beagles (R&SB), a club founded in 1932 - just one year after Vets AC. The reason cited for such drastic action was lack of club officials, team managers and the like.

In previous years R&SB organised open meetings at Crystal Palace, an annual road running event and even constructed a club house at their Battlebridge Road track. They also boasted such members as current joint high jump record holder Debbie Marti, who cleared 1.95m in 1997, and cross-country international Bob Treadwell, twice a former Southern Champion and still an active member of Vets AC.

News is now filtering through of the possible demise of Hull Achilles AC due to their finding no volunteers to fill the post of Secretary and Treasurer

Added to this, clubs such as Border Harriers and Rugby & Northampton AC are said to be withdrawing from British League competition due to a lack of Team Managers.

Even my first claim club, Hercules Wimbledon AC whose origins date back to 1933, are having difficulties in attracting the younger brigade to take on officiating, coaching and administrative roles and I wouldn't even their committee.

These aforementioned problems are nothing new and many a club has continued their existence over the years solely due to the efforts of just one or two key officials. You only have to look at South London Harriers. who in my early days of athletics. appeared to be solely run by the late 'Tommy' Thomas. Rumour has it, that when the club finally persuaded him to step down at the age of 73 after 34 years as



Club Secretary it took six members to take on his duties.

Recent comments by the Association of GB Athletic Clubs (ABAC) emphasised the current problems when stating, "British athletics clubs are the breeding ground and pathway for all our international athletes and through them have come every single British medallist and world record holder since athletics began.

"It has long been recognised that many of the leading athletic clubs are sustained by a handful of ageing officials. Some clubs have been fortunate enough to find vounger officials but the majority are not so fortunate."

An argument often put forward in explaining the lack of officials is. "Athletes are now continuing to compete as veterans and don't take on any admin roles." However you only have to look at the current Veterans AC list of officers to dare calculate the average age of see that this is a fallacy. There you will see, and in no particular order. Peter Hannell, Dennis Williams, Mike May, Philip Bell, Ron Franklin, and Chris Flint who to my knowledge all find time to train hard and compete hard.

The race shared the Hercules champs and the Inter Club format usually held in December. So Croydon Harriers and Wimbledon Windmilers took part and swelled the race but apparently without knowing it was the VAC Champs.

A new name in terms of cross country in the VAC, Len Reilly, won the Champs with a well judged run.

On the first lap title holder Vic Maughn, 45, contested the lead with the two Hercules seniors.

Then on lap 2 Philip Glynn,

race winner, had a three sec lead over Len Reilly, the VAC winner.

Maughn was now in third, eight secs back but ahead of the second Hercules and 12 secs clear of Cavell.

Attwell, Morgan, Gray and Wallace followed, now strung out behind the fast pace of the leader. Then a ten metre blanket covered Mann, Donald, Dickinson and Plested.

In mid race Balme had 18 secs on Brownhill, before 9 secs to O'Hare and Betts.

At the finish Len Reilly, of Kent AC, was still race second and so headed the VAC season's table with 33:31. Previously he had won at 1500m in Track Champs.

Gareth Cavell, 42, on his first run here, came past Maughn to be first 40 as the first three finished closely, inside 22 seconds.

Barry Attwell made return to some form by being fourth VAC, only 11 seconds back, and first M55, for which he received the trophy later. Barry was pursuing Matthew Sharp, a son of Maurice Sharp, and raced in with Tony Harran, guesting.

First 50 was Bill Gristwood in ninth place, ahead of Lauriston champion Steve Sinnott.

Thirteenth in, Colin Oxlade could have been awarded the 50 silver had he known he was eligible as a member for the VAC race. A fixture domino effect had started in Surrey County.

No doubt about M60 though; Mike Mann held Charlie Dickinson by eight seconds to continue his good form since turning 60. Mann was faster than last year while course expert Charlie was reappearing after

several years. Peter Hamilton, who gave the race status when he was 40, with a hat trick, was now third 60.

A visitor yet enrolled member, Carey Gray, of Bingley Harriers, was 3rd 50. A link was Neil and Stephanie Robson, northerners who were in London, but at all events Gray finds himself in Oxfordshire looking after a parent.

First woman for VAC and the race was Claire Donald, a runner who makes it look easy. She clocked 37:48 which is the W50

club record, bettering specialist Jane Georghiou's best of five runs, 37:54 in 2005. This followed Claire's record in the Epsom 10, 68:29, which we didn't acknowledge in last newsletter, making a rare double.


