

Intensity of the new name from Thames Valley

Steve was born in Belfast, son Steve turned on full power of a pro football player. He came to England and now works for MoD in London.

In the VAC CC he had Vic Maughn putting pressure on him in the race but also helping when Steve went off course once or twice, shouting him back. He felt Vic was the threat on the last lap so



when he met the last hill and finished very strongly.

He says the steeplechase had taught him the importance of the final stages of a race where energy might be failing, a stumble could break your rhythm or a fall prove disastrous. In the All Ireland champs he was 6th in stee-

plechase and it was memorable because the Taoiseach and Sonia O'Sullivan were present and shed lustre on the event.

Over there again he ran the reputed Ballycotton 10. course, and got a sub 60.

In Bolivia he was high up at La Paz; but trying to do his usual 400m reps at 12.000 feet was too much so he had no benefit from his altitude training.

Entirely different was Bosnia where he had to beware of land mines laid beside the road in Herzegovina. Hogging the crown of the road was the best way to run there.

Steve had never heard of VAC and was even beginning to think 40 might be the end of the road for his athletics till Bob Belmore

changed all that. At a race Bob told him to join VAC and he let him see his passion.

But he quotes the philosophy of Nelson Mandela that "There is no passion to be found playing small - in settling for a life that is less than the one you are capable of living". By way of another mantra he says the late master coach Frank Horwill would have said "Keep going, keep going, keep going" until something inside you begins to say "keep going".

One preference is for Ethiopian matters; not only their famous runners but also in sleet, on an up and down their diet. He says there are Ethiopian restaurants in London and your running might be none the worse if you tried their staple food called injera - a flat bread, to scoop up sauces and meat.

> In the 5M HW he was first VAC and four minutes ahead of Mike Mann. Compare that with the VAC CC where the gap between them was 5:20 and you see how consistent runners can be when they are trying their best.

His employment in the Civil Service will see him in Battersea Park this summer for their 10K Road Champs. where we wish him luck.

resort and sent a women's team with Cathy Ulliott and Julia Armstrong; tho' we don't have team results.



Neil Robson, father of Stephanie, was with Fred Gibbs and Bingley team. >p12



Teaching of Percy Cerrutty, c 1977

"The most obvious problem athletes have is that they don't properly use their lungs, The oxygen debt runners experience in races or training could be reduced with what Percy called 'full-lung aeration'. The amount of oxygen that comes into the upper and lower lung when fully filled is about 3,500 CCs. In the orthodox method of running, the lungs only take in about 1,500 ccs.

Percy's techniques of natural movement, which he taught at Portsea were designed to get more oxygen into the upper lobes of the lungs, which would lead to more efficient and faster running. Percy taught that if an athlete were taught to utilise his lungs fully, he could cut huge margins off his best time. After a year with Cerrutty, I had no doubt that the development of full-lung aeration could completely revolutionise the world of athletics.

The runner cannot suck oxygen into his lungs" Percy said. "He has to take the pressure off the upper lobes of the lungs or they will never fill. The lungs are made up of tiny air sacs, not muscles. When the shoulder comes up to shorten the muscles in the neck, this motion alone takes the pressure off the upper lobes so that oxygen can rush in naturally."

The reason most runners are worn down in a race is simply because of a lack of oxygen to oxidise the glycogen that is fed to the working muscles.

The chief means of filling the lungs, while lifting the shoulders is to vary the arm movements. Emil Zatopek was the best example of this. He forced more oxygen into his lungs when other athletes were succumbing to oxygen debt and the build up of lactic acid."

Cerutty was famous for his work with miler Herb Elliott, use of sandhills and keeping a communal training camp, like Africans do now. taken from

Norris had a 14 sec lead on Maughn in lap 2. On the final lap he attacked the hill determinedly and finished under full power for 32:34.

Previous winner Mick Boyle and mens' record holder came through to be second and first 50.

Lee held on for third place ahead of Maughn to get the M45 gold, a minute behind the winner. While Scot lan Johnston on first run here was a close fourth.

Clare Elms was very impressive as she achieved the women's all time best in this event. Maggie Statham's 12 year old W45 record was bettered by 39 secs to final 35:18.

A classic competition was that in W55 class. Jane Georghiou took the lead early on but found her margin under threat when Andrea Sanders-Reece closed to only seven seconds on lap 2. Andrea maintained this challenge but the Farnham course expert's forte of hill running enabled her to draw away by the end to 12 secs lead. Pam Jones proved to be the first over 75 woman at VAC as she

also headed the two 75 men. Terry O'Neill took the 55 gold racing with Glen Morgan as he

had Carey Gray in pursuit.

Then first 60 was the ever present figure of Mike Mann. He had two minutes lead over the hardy pair of Graham Ball and Gerry Smith.

Bill Gristwood had the M50 bronze, leading Ola Balme. She was second only to clubmate Clare as Ola was clear W40 gold.

Michael Mann has enjoyed good success in VAC cross and the Hercules minor races.

But in complete contract he came down to 800m at Lee Valley on the boards and prevailed over experts Ken Daniel and Ed Connolly in a one second blanket finish.

West 4 Harriers, led by Alison Brownhill, brought a party over. They made a tight group in mid race led by Louise Ferguson in 19th place, half a minute before Rose Lewis, Rachel Badham and improving Keith Simpson.

After the W55s, Ros Tabor, first

60, was closing and only 10 secs away. Ros was followed by Clare Wyngard for the 50 gold, with Jo Quantrill in pursuit. So Dulwich recorded a

notable ladies foursome. doubtless born of efficacious training in Burbage Road. 'The Burbagers', do we say? Long timer Lesley

Bowcott, who has run with VAC since the 1980s, and always smiling, looked good for the 65 medal.

The Hercules 5 Mile Multi Terrain was popular with all standards as VAC filled nearly a third of the list. The flat course made a change from the character building gradients on the other side of the Common and none the worse for New Year's Eve.

In front Stu Littlewood's son Alex Bruce, home from McNeece State University USA, modestly showed his class as a senior. Only a few years since his run as a junior in a VAC vets race had provoked argument about 'vets only here' it was good to witness youthful promise being fulfilled, was it not. Marie Synott-Wells' fast time was named a record and probably a sound one, of 32:58, after her prominent spell in the autumn. She was 3rd VAC in the National too.




