New name Stephen Philcox did not wait for a lead on his first run; he came past 10 yards ahead of David Symons and increased his lead to half a minute at the end.

Stephen, 47, has been running and winning a large number of Park Runs and in road races in Essex such as Southend 10K Classic was first veteran.

David Symons, 44, has also enjoyed success in Park Runs and was third, first veteran, in a marathon in Cologne, not to mention tenth in Surrey League Div 1 last season.

The next two places were filled by Ravens. Their club was founded by City insurance men, who naturally sport a raven on black and white colours. That was Simon Phillips and Rupert Holden, both M45, and we hope to see them again.

First lady was Victoria Carter of Serpentine, who took the high place of fifth in the race. She had won at Edinburgh Half Marathon, and other races such as the Last Friday 5K. Running alone she clocked 32:11, similar class to that of Bernie Pritchett in 2011.

Championship pace spread right down the race so that many gained a quicker time, such as Carol Jones, Peter Crowhurst, Dennis Williams, Alan Davidson, and Reading Road's Richard Hammerson. Brian Shave, second oldest to RPK at 80, took a silver.

David Kitcher made a well timed reappearance here to run out winner by a whole minute as older athletes dominated.

Best of three came early for Edwin Bartlett, from Kent. He must have longevity genes, as a lasting member for more than a decade.

Obituary: Jack FitzGerald Jack was a pillar of veterans athletics. When Sylvester Stein founded Veterans Athletics paper in the '80s Jack was his right hand man and source of knowledge on the sector.

Under Jack's direction the first BMAF Half Marathon enjoyed an entry unthinkable today, in four figures. While locally he organised the Mitcham 25k races, for his old club.

As competitor he was winning VAC M70 class at Battersea 5 in 1993 off 38 mins. while in his 60s he ran the London Marathon in 3:20.

Recently he had to change to the Walk to keep competing, until a few years ago.

Jack was modest to a fault, seldom speaking of his war experiences in the RAF for instance.

But he found huge satisfaction in working for athletics. In that sphere his personal qualities of clear thinking, allied to great vigour and sense of humour, enjoyed full opportunity and respect.


