

Tadworth's Hazel Imeson was 125th for NI W55. We saw that name Tuohy again but in Belfast it was Irish and a female!

# Sprinting 0 to 10 metres a four hour session. Story by Nick Lauder


Whilst being the oldest Vets club is something to be proud of, a few of our members met up in October as they wanted to make sure that it isn't the main thing we are known for.

These members talked about ways of how to improve Vets AC as a club, and its approach so that our annual fee is not seen as giving little more than a licence to compete. It was thought it would best to get members together on a more regular basis. It was also felt that organising members along a 'squad' based approach, would be a positive development so that like-minded members could meet others who they could identify with, and also help one another to meet their training goals.

Several sprinters – Nick Lauder/Mike May/Phil Bell – agreed to arrange a trial Sprinters 'Gettogether' where members who were interested in sprints could meet up and train together. If this was successful, more sprint-based Vets AC 'Event days' could be held and the 'squad' model could be rolled out across other event groups if there were members willing to organise sessions for their own discipline e.g. for Walking, Jumps, Throws, and Distance.

Additionally, Phil Bell (p.bell5@sky.com) has sent out a survey to find out the events that members like to compete in, whether they would like to represent the club in either of the Inter Area matches in 2012, and, importantly, how they would like to contribute to the club.

Saturday 1st December saw Vets AC hold a first trial Sprinters 'Get-together' at Lee Valley Athletics Centre which was entitled 'Starts, 0–10m'. The morning saw the central 60m track taken over by fourteen 'older' ath-

letes much to the surprise of some of the younger regulars such as sprint talents Jodie Williams and Olympic cauldron-lighter, Desirée Henry.

The session began at 9am, with athletes getting into small groups, and taking turns to be photographed in their usual 'Set' position from their right side, left side, front and rear using a High Definition camera. The photos were then compared to a technical model, Asafa Powell. The athletes and the rest of the group discussed what was 'Good' about the current 'Set' position, what could be 'Better' and 'How' that could be achieved. Each athlete was then photographed again, this time, in their improved 'Set' position.

High Speed video footage was then taken of each athlete accelerating from a block start to 10m. This was repeated several times with cameras shooting from both sides and in front. The 0–10m section had cone markers at every 1m point. This meant that stride lengths and relative speed > p6

## Sprint skills continued

One hundred and forty photos/videos later, Nick Lauder, who arranged and organised the morning's session, led a review of some of the footage.

Kinovea, a free sports analysis software, was used by Nick to show the sprinters how they could easily and quickly confirm if they were achieving their target foot placements as well as relative speed, stride lengths, torso and shin angles.

A demonstration of the key features of Kinovea included slow-motion frame-by-frame review, and how to add reference lines and angles. Athletes were encouraged to analyse their own performances using the 'Good', 'Better', 'How'

which had begun at 9am, didn't finish until 1.15pm.

It wasn't just the Vets AC members who were impressed






# Surrey League Div 4

### Let's hear it for Dulwich Runners

Every year Dulwich have club champs over a range of distances and one of them is 10M. Epsom proved a successful alternative to the Cabbage Patch 10 for the 2011, with 36 Dulwich Runners taking part. in 2012 This meant around one in nine of the competitors were from the club.

Tony Tuohy led the way. In his first year as a M50, he has been setting PBs and he was the first M50 in the race in sixth place in 58:45 and first Dulwich Runner ahead of another Vet, Charlie Lound.

M50 Steve Smythe, M60 Mike Mann, M55 Andy Murray, W60 Ros Tabor and W50 Clare Wyngard all won Veterans AC medals.

In the Dulwich club Champs, which is decided on age grading, Ros Tabor's 72:55 at age 63 was the winner scoring 938 points, or 93.8% based on current age grading table. Tuohy scored 875 in second while another W60 Claire Steward was third on 853 points.

### Algarve Challenge, November 7-11

This low key event has always been well supported by VAC members and that was again the case in 2012. There are four races in the Monte Gordo area which is a runners' paradise with runs through the Algarve national forest and along the beach. The track has been the base for the British athletics team for recent camps including the Olympics.

Former winner Ros Tabor led the way after the first two events, a 5km cross-country and the track mile, but she was unable to complete the challenge as she had decided to run at the Vets International at

The M65's performances were 21:43 in the tough 5km cross-country, 6:10.5 for the track mile, 44:18 for the 10km trail handicap and then 77:37 for the 11 mile Milhas de Guardiana, run from Spain to Portugal.

VAC members in the top 10 were: 2nd Martyn Rouse 3169; 3 Steve Smythe 3092; 5 Alan Davidson 2758; 7 Cliff Hide 2696; 8 Dennis Williams 2582; 10 Alastair Jackson 2282, with David Brooks 11th.

Details of 2013 Algarve Challenge, likely to be in November and with the 11 mile run from Portugal to Spain will be available from Track and Field Tours – official travel agents for international masters events.


### Correspondent Alan Davidson also writes:

I ran 1:30 and was delighted my taped-up achilles survived four races.

Pippa Major was a good second woman and first vet from four others. Challenging Giles, Peter Kennedy





closed from half a minute behind on lap 2 to just 8 seconds. So this was a match between national vet contenders at middle distance.
